
Introduction


Background Studies

Some background studies regarding the modes of transport students use when travelling to the campus are summarised in graphs below:


a.) Graph shows modes of transport for college student from 1986 to 2016.

How it Works?

- Specially designed to vend emergency bicycle repair parts and cycling essentials such as safety equipment and locks.
- Operates in the same way as a common vending machine
- The vending machine could be customised to accept coins, cash, bank cards, phone payment (NFC) and student card.

How it Helps?

- Students can self-repair their bikes in case of an emergency.
- A cheaper way to repair your bike as there is no extra labour cost needed.
- No constraint from the business hours of bike repair shop and repair whenever you want as it operates 24/7.
- Feedback forms would be provided alongside the machine for users to suggest items they would like to have in the vending machine.

Existing Machine

- The idea of vending machine with bicycle repair parts was already existed and implemented in the United State of America.

What is in The Machine and its Price?

Bike Lock	€5.00	-
Bike Spokes	€8.00	€10.00

- Price of items in the vending machine are estimated based on online retail price from Chain Reaction Cycles (Available at: www.chainreactioncycles.com/ie/en)
- Price to fix some of the common bike problems in the Belfield Bike Shop are much higher than the cost of self-repair.

- Data from CSO Ireland shows the number of student cyclists has increased from 2011.
