Introduction from Tim Gaston, Programme Director, NTA

What is Connecting Ireland?

Connecting Ireland Rural Mobility Plan (the Plan) is a major public transport initiative developed by the National Transport Authority (NTA) with the aim of increasing connectivity for people living outside our major cities and towns. The Plan aims to improve mobility in rural areas, and it will do this by providing better connections between villages and towns to facilitate access to local services as well as providing connectivity to an enhanced regional network connecting cities and regional centres nationwide. The NTA consulted both stakeholders and the public on the Plan.





Connecting Ireland Timeline

In 2022 the NTA analysed feedback received from the public consultation and, where appropriate, integrated amendments / alternative suggestions into the Plan.

Throughout 2022, Phase 1 of the Plan has delivered a number of new and enhanced bus services. The revisions were implemented on routes and services serving areas in counties Cavan, Monaghan, Donegal, Clare, Sligo, Kildare, Offaly, Mayo and Wexford.

Throughout the remainder of 2022, the NTA aims to continue to implement further services across the State, and start the procurement for proposals due to enter service in 2023. This rate of improvement of bus services has and will continue to be achieved in a sector facing severe challenges due to increases in the cost of fuel, lack of both vehicle and trained drivers, both of which have been brought about by the recent pandemic and geopolitical events across the world.

The rollout of new and improved services is continuing on a phased basis from 2023 to 2026. Please check back here and on social media to keep up to date with the latest progress in delivering the Plan, and to see how it has helped the transport sector to contribute to wider sustainability and climate change mitigation objectives.

TFI Local Link Service Launches

Between April and October 2022, TFI Local Link in conjunction with the NTA delivered 17 new and enhanced services. Of these the following 6 were brand new services:

Bus Éireann Service Launches

In October 2022, Bus Éireann in conjunction with NTA delivered 8 new and enhanced services. Five services within the Limerick area and 3 in the north east. Of these the following 3 were brand new services:

Service improvements in action: Enhanced 978 Bus Service from Belmullet to Castlebar

Route 978 Belmullet to Castlebar originally provided 2 return services between Belmullet and Castlebar Monday to Saturday, with 24 trips per week. In its current form, the bus route did not provide a mid-day return service from Castlebar to Belmullet or operate a service on Sunday. As part of the Connecting Ireland programme, the route was analysed and areas for improvement were identified by the NTA's Service Planning team.

Since the 13th June, the enhanced 978 service now provides greater connectivity and flexibility than ever before for the communities in Belmullet, Glencastle, Bangor Erris, Mulranny, Newport and Castlebar with a 75% increase in service levels going from 24 trips per week Monday to Saturday to 42 trips per week Monday to Sunday. The enhanced service now operates three times a day, seven days a week with a new regular Sunday and Bank Holiday service, new mid-day service from Castlebar to Belmullet and peak-time service for commuters to Castlebar offering improved connectivity to regional bus and rail services.

TFI Local Link Mayo Manager, Sarah Togher said: "The timetable for the revised 978 service has increased passenger connectivity options substantially accommodating travel between Erris and Achill to both Castlebar and Westport through a service interchange at Mulranny. The 978 Belmullet to Castlebar service now connects with the Bus Éireann 450 Achill to Westport twice daily at Mulranny. This vital service that provides greater options for rural dwellers on the route to access training, education, employment as well as access to health care services including Mayo University Hospital."

What passengers have said:

"If it wasn't for TFI Local Link and Route 978 I wouldn't be able to get to college. I would have no other way to travel." $\,$

"This service means a lot because I don't drive. It allows me to get away for a few hours and get my shopping."

"Apart from connectivity, it's a way to meet people. Social isolation is at an all-time high and this service allows us to get out and meet people."

"We're travelling around all around Ireland by bus and train - this service is the best connection to Ballycroy. It's also an environmental decision - the bus is much better than using a car as its going anyways."



Year to date, there has been a 310% increase in patronage on Route 978 (Jan 21– Oct 21 – **1719** vs Jan 22 – Oct 22 **7348**). Impacts of the improvements can be seen in the below graphic:

The estimated implementation dates are indicative and may change for a number of reasons:

- The duration of the planning and design process, involving liaison with Local Authorities, TFI Local Link Offices, representatives, lobby groups, passengers and transport service providers to provide enhanced levels of service in response to growth and changes in demand for transport;
- Discussions with operators where licensed services and proposed PSO services co-exist on the same corridor; and
- Availability of service providers and drivers in particular following the impacts of Covid19 and macro-economic factors brought about by the conflict in Ukraine on the industry.

Given the rapidly changing environment, it is important that the Connecting Ireland team is able to be agile and flexible in its management of the programme, so that where progress is impacted, other plans can be advanced instead. This Bulletin reflects the Authority's intention as of today, but is likely to change to respond to changing circumstances.
