

Determination of a Public Service Obligation following amendments to services between Kilkenny - Naas

Determination of Public Service Obligation as a result of the license amendment to Route 717 Dublin Airport – Clonmel.



1. Introduction

On the 4th of November 2024 J.J. Kavanagh & Sons applied to the National Transport Authority (the NTA) for amendments to a regular licensed service on their Route 717 Dublin Airport - Clonmel.

The license amendment for Route 717 relates to the removal of stops, specifically at Castlecomer, Crettyard, Newtown Cross, Ballylynan, Athy, Kilcullen, and Naas, and the adjustment of timings for two services.

This results in the removal of three daily services from Clonmel to Dublin via Castlecomer, Crettyard, Newtown Cross, Ballylynan, Athy, Kilcullen, and Naas and two in the opposite direction. These services operated Monday to Sunday.

Additionally, the stop in Kilkenny was moved from Castlecomer Road to MacDonagh Station. This change has limited impacts, and it is not assessed in this Determination Report.

These amendments were granted on the 5th of November 2024.

This Determination Report assesses whether there is a Public Service Obligation (PSO) resulting from these changes, or whether the existing transport options in the area are sufficient to cater for local demand, taking into account socio-economic considerations.

1.1 Route Map




Figure 1 – Route 717 Alignment

Figure 1 below shows Route 717 with the withdrawn Route variant via Castlecomer shown in blue.

1.2 Timetable Analysis

Route 717 provides a connection between Clonmel, Dublin City and Dublin Airport with an end-toend journey time of approximately 3 hours and 25 minutes. The journey time for the impacted settlements ranges from 2 hours 20 minutes for Castlecomer to Dublin, and 1 hour 35 minutes for Kilcullen to Dublin.

Prior to the license amendment, there were three daily services between Clonmel, Dublin City and Dublin Airport. These services operated Monday through Sunday, with stops at Castlecomer, Crettyard, Newtown Cross, Ballylynan, Athy, Kilcullen, and Naas, while in the opposite direction, there were two daily services, also running Monday through Sunday, stopping at the same locations.

The proposed changes to the Route 717 timetable are shown in Table 1. The stops and stopping times which have been removed or changed as a result of this amendment are marked in red.

The impact of this amendment is the following:

- Route 717 will no longer provide service to Castlecomer, Crettyard, Newtown Cross, Ballylynan, Athy, Kilcullen, and Naas, causing a reduction in direct service and an increase in journey time for passengers along this alignment.

2. Settlement Analysis

2.1 Demand Analysis

The table below highlights the daily number of people travelling between the locations on Route 717 for all modes of transport.

2.2 Castlecomer

As a result of the Route 717 license amendment, Castlecomer is no longer served by the Route 717 services shown in Table 3.




Figure 2 – Route 717, 838 and 897

While the Direct link from Castlecomer to Dublin is now severed as a result of the removal of Route 717, this connection is still provided via an interchange in either Kilkenny or Carlow. Both Routes 838 and 897 provide connections to Kilkenny, and Route 897 provides a connection to Carlow.

Passengers travelling from Castlecomer to Dublin would now travel via Carlow on the 897, a journey of approximately 34 minutes. These passengers then have interchange opportunities onto bus or rail services, taking on average 1 hour 40 minutes from Carlow to Dublin.

In total, this would amount to 2 hours 10 minutes journey time for this trip, which results in an increase of 30 minutes on the 1 hour 45 minutes previously offered via Route 717. The options for trips to Dublin are shown in Table 5 below.

In the opposite direction, there are similar options from Dublin back to Castlecomer in the evening. These options are provided via interchange in either Athy or Carlow and both options utilise Local Link Route 897. Table 6 below shows these options and associated travel times.

It should be noted that the timings for both the outbound and return journeys can be inconvenient as morning departures are slightly too early and evening return journeys arrive back too late.

Trips from Castlecomer to Clonmel can still be made with an interchange in Kilkenny via Route 897, approx. 38 minutes, and interchange onto Route 717 for approx. 50 minutes journey time.

In conclusion, the removal of Route 717 does have an impact on passengers travelling between local settlements and Dublin, in particular in the morning and evening.

2.3 Crettyard and Newtown

Similar to Castlecomer, Crettyard and Newtown have also been impacted by the removal of 3 inbound (to Dublin) and 2 return trips on Route 717, similar to those trips shown in Table 3 in previous section.

Crettyard is served by the services shown in Table 7.




Figure 3 - Route 717, 822, 838 and 897

While the Direct link to Dublin is now severed as a result of the removal of Route 717, this connection is still provided via an indirect link to either Kilkenny or Carlow. Routes 838 and 897 provide connections to Kilkenny, and Routes 822 and 897 provide connections to Carlow. Journey times for connections from Crettyard and Newtown to and from Dublin are very similar to those shown in Table 5 and Table 6 in the previous section.

The impacts of the withdrawn Route 717 service are very similar to those outlined for Castlecomer. The first and last departures on Route 897 provide the best connections for those traveling to and from

Dublin via Carlow or Athy. In conclusion, the removal of Route 717 does have an impact on passengers travelling between local settlements and Dublin, particularly in the morning and evening times.

2.4 Ballylynan

The population of Ballylynan c.1,167 as per the 2022 census, is currently served by the following routes.




Figure 4 - Route 717, IW06 and 897

Route 897 doesn't directly connect either Dublin or Clonmel. Therefore, passengers travelling to Dublin or Clonmel would have to interchange in Athy, Carlow or Kilkenny.

Journey times for connections from Ballylynan to and from Dublin are very similar to those shown in Table 5 and Table 6 in the Castlecomer section of this report. However, there are some additional interchange options for residents from Ballylynan for travel to and from Dublin.

Similar to the other towns impacted by the withdrawal of Route 717, travel options to and from Dublin have reduced.

In conclusion, the removal of Route 717 does have an impact on passengers travelling between local settlements and Dublin, in particular at morning and evening times.

2.5 Athy and Kilcullen

Although Athy and Kilcullen are no longer served by Route 717, these locations still have good connections to both Carlow, Naas and Dublin.

The population of Athy (c.11,000 people) is served by the following services:




Figure 5 - Services between Athy, Kilcullen and Naas

For both Athy and Kilcullen Route 130 provides direct services to and from Dublin in addition to Routes 838 and 892 which provide a number of services to and from Newbridge, providing interchange opportunities for services to Dublin. Athy also has direct rail services to Dublin.

Route 880 provides a further connection from Kilcullen to Naas, as well as additional interchange opportunities to Dublin.

It should be noted that the 130 service is being enhanced, and this is estimated to take place in Q4 2025. The new timetable will provide additional departures from Athy and Kilcullen to Naas and also Sallins Train Station.

2.6 Naas

Naas has a population of approximately 26,000. The town has good connections to both Athy and Kilcullen, as shown in Table 12 and Table 13. In addition, it also has good public transport links to

other surrounding towns. Naas also benefits from good links to Dublin via Route 126, operated by Go-Ahead Ireland, and Route 726, operated by Dublin Coach. Naas is also near the Rail network via Sallins Train Station, which is served by both Commuter and InterCity rail services.

Although Naas has been impacted by the withdrawal of this variation of Route 717, the level of service and connections remain adequate.

3. Conclusions

In conclusion, the license amendment for Route 717 has a negative impact on the residents of Castlecomer, Crettyard, Newtown Cross and Ballylynan. While there are some impacts on the settlements of Athy and Kilcullen, there are good connections to surrounding settlements and direct connections to Dublin via Rail and Route 130. There is also a planned enhancement to the existing Route 130 service, which will provide additional services for residents of Athy and Kilcullen

The main impacts result in increased journey times for those travelling from these locations to and from Dublin.

To address this issue and enhance connectivity for the impacted settlements, the NTA will review and optimise the timetable on Route 897 (Kilkenny - Athy). The purpose of this optimisation process is to add additional departures to better provide for morning and evening return trips to Dublin for the settlements of Castlecomer, Crettyard, Newtown and Ballylynan. This adjustment aims to mitigate the impact of the Route 717 amendment and ensure continued accessibility.

4. Determination

The Authority has determined that there is a public service obligation to improve the service levels on the Kilkenny to Athy section of the Dublin Airport – Clonmel corridor. As a result of this determination, I recommend that the Authority should now carry out an optimisation of Route 897 with the objective being to address service gaps.
